NAME OF PROCEDURE: Upper endoscopy with biopsy and flexible sigmoidoscopy with biopsy.

INDICATIONS: Failure to thrive and history of gastroesophageal (GE) reflux.

PROCEDURE: The patient was placed under general anesthesia, and the GIF-XP Olympus 140 endoscope was introduced into the esophagus without difficulty. The esophagus was examined in a 360 degree circumferential fashion. There was no note of any distinct abnormalities throughout the length of the esophagus. The distal area of the esophagus appeared to have a normal appearing sphincter tone. The stomach was then intubated. Again, it appeared completely normal throughout its length. Biopsies were obtained x2 in the antrum. The endoscope was advanced into the duodenum which again appeared completely normal throughout its length as well. Biopsies were obtained x2 in this area as well. The endoscope was withdrawn slowly. Biopsies were obtained in the distal esophagus, and the procedure was completed after suctioning stomach contents one additional time. The patient was then repositioned, and the endoscope was introduced into the rectum without difficulty. The rectum was examined in a 360 degree circumferential fashion. There was no note of any abnormalities present. Biopsies were obtained x1, and the procedure was completed. Estimated blood loss was none. Informed consent was obtained. The patient was to continue on Periacin 1 mg p.o. t.i.d. and Zantac 2 mg per kilogram per dose b.i.d. while awaiting the biopsy reports.
