NAME OF PROCEDURE: Upper endoscopy, flexible sigmoidoscopy, and biopsy with phlebotomy.

INDICATIONS: Celiac disease and poor growth.

PROCEDURE: The patient was placed under general anesthesia by Dr. David Ladd. He had previously undergone an ophthalmologic procedure by Dr. Robert King. We had placed a bite block without difficulty. We then put the XP-140 Olympus endoscope into the esophagus without difficulty. The esophagus was examined in a 360 degree circumferential fashion. There was no note of any distinct abnormalities throughout the length of the esophagus. The stomach was intubated and appeared to be normal throughout its length. The duodenum was then intubated and examined down to the level of the third portion. It appeared completely normal to visualize exam. Biopsies were then obtained x4 in the duodenum for examination of possible celiac disease and x2 in the distal esophagus. This portion of the procedure was completed. The patient was then repositioned. The endoscope was introduced into the rectum without difficulty. Biopsies were obtained x2 in the sigmoid area. That portion of the procedure was completed as well. Patient then had a blood draw of approximately 7 cc for celiac disease testing. The procedure was then completed. Estimated blood loss was none. Informed consent was obtained.
