PLENEAU BAY AND PORT CHARCOT, AND CAPE TUXEN

0500	Early morning Wake up call please enjoy coffee etc
0530 0830	We hope to be able to split the landing and zodiac cruising between two adjacent areas: Port Charcot and Pleneau Island. Pleneau island is well known as a 'iceberg graveyard' where whales and especially leopard seals are found. Port Charcoy is where Jean-Baptiste Charcot overwintered in his ship <i>Francais</i> and is a wonderfully protected bay with a superb look-out point. Breakfast is served
0900	We will be sailing through the Penola Straight, a very scenic area towards Cape Tuxen . EXPEDITION MORNING where we hope to explore the prominent cape by foot as well as by zodiac.
